Nicolas Bricas

Nicolas Bricas is a socio-economist working on food at the Cirad (Centre de cooperation international en recherche agronomique pour le développement). He is also at the head of the UNESCO World Food Systems Chair. He works on sustainable food systems and urban food policies.



Pauline Bendjebbar

Pauline Bendjebbar is currently a PhD student in political science at the University of Paris-Est, under the supervision of Ève Fouilleux, within a research team of the Cirad. Her doctoral research deals with the institutionalization trajectories of the model of organic farming in the African context with a comparative research between Uganda and Benin.



Musa Muwanga

Musa Muwanga is the managing Director of Frutrac Ltd, an organic export company in Uganda. Previously, he was the Chief Executive Officer, and one of the founders of the National Organic Agricultural Movement of Uganda (NOGAMU). He has participated in the building of the organic movement in Africa and he has contributed in the setting up of several national Organic Agriculture networks in several African countries



Patrice Chateau

Patrice Chateau is Deputy Mayor of the City of Dijon, in charge of the management of green spaces and the share of organic products in municipal catering. Having definitively excluded the use of chemicals from the public space, he is currently working to increase the share of organic products in school. Since 2017, he has been secretary of the organization "Un plus Bio".



Claudio Serafini

Claudio Serafini has long been committed to organic farming in Italy and Europe. In 2012-2013 he was a member of the European Commission advisory group on the legal framework for organic agriculture. He has been chairman of Città del Bio and is currently director of the Organic Cities Network Europe (which includes cities engaged in sustainable food such as Paris, Vienna, Milan or Nuremberg).

Ewa Rembiałkowska

Ewa Rembiałkowska works in the Organic Food Division at the Faculty of Human Nutrition and Consumer Sciences in Warsaw University of Life Sciences, Poland. In her research activity, she deals with the nutritional value of organic and conventional crops, and the influence of organic food on human and animal health.



Pierre Souvet

Cardiologist in the Bouches-du-Rhône, in France, Pierre Souvet is the chairman and co-founder of the organization ASEF (Association Santé et Environnement France). In 2008, he was elected "Doctor of the year" on account of his fight on environmental health issues. In 2016, he published a book called "200 alertes santé environnement".



Denis Lairon

Denis Lairon, is Emeritus research director at the Inserm. He has worked for a long time on the relationship between diet, metabolism and health. He is now focused on the sustainability of food and food systems, including Mediterranean diet, organic food (with the Bionutrinet epidemiological project), particularly on the links between food and health.

Mohamed Fedal, known as Moha, is the first Chef to have revisited Moroccan cuisine. He devotes a large part of his time to transmitting his know-how during cooking shows or cooking demonstrations. He is involved in the organization "Bon pour le climat" which proposes concrete and positive actions to change our food habits and he wishes to raise the Moroccan gastronomy to the rank of cultural heritage of humanity.

Carmen Calverley has been an expert in the EU Commission with the Organic Promotion Campaign between 2007 and 2009.
