In a recent report, the Food and Agriculture Organization of the United Nations (FAO) underlines the threat to our food system and more generally to our environment due to the loss of biodiversity. Organic farming is a production method that preserves the environment.

Agence BIO organizes a seminar to carry out a collective and participatory reflection. Several global stakeholders of the organic sector will present their commitment towards available and affordable organic products, as well as international trade that is respectful of nature and working conditions.

As the negotiations for the next Common Agricultural Policy are currently ongoing, the seminar will end with a discussion on payments for environmental services and the funding schemes promoting nature conservation actions by organic farmers.
